SOCIO-ECONOMIC STATUS OF TOTO TRIBE OF ALIPURDUAR DISTRICT, WEST BENGAL

Introduction

eople in a primitive society who recognise the leadership of a tribal chief and share a strong sense of community due to shared cultural values are said to be living in a tribe. The tribal people of India are distinguished by the fact that they live in their own unique ecosystem. The Toto are a primitive people who have lived in relative seclusion in inhospitable, challenging terrain for millennia and whose way of life has remained almost unchanged. In comparison to other populations, theirs is very tiny and growing at a slow rate. Despite the fact that the Toto people have been independent for 65 years, they still face several social and economic challenges (Dhargupta, 2009).

According to folklore, the term "Toto" originated with a group of persons hired by the British during their war with Bhutan in 1865 to help transport tota (cartridges) and other supplies (Sarkar, 1993). Dhaniram Toto (2011) notes that the group was formerly called as Jepang Jiten Totvi Tota Toto.

The Toto are a Mongoloid-looking Indo-Bhutanese people group known for their broad, square faces, thick lips, small eyes, and dark irises. There are 13 main exogamous family
