### **AUDIT QUESTIONS**

The auditors are guided by the question given in each section in carrying out the academic audit of departments. These questions guide the formulation of the Self Evaluation Documents (SED).

### I. Defining intended learning outcomes:

### Q. How do you formulate learning outcomes?

Ans. Learning outcome is properly approved by IQAC and Governing Body of the college.

### Q. Are data for such surveys analysed so that you can established a priori case?

Ans. Yes.

### Q. What have you learned from former students and employers?

Ans. There is a pressing need for the expansion and diversification of career-oriented programs that cater to the diverse interests and aspirations of the student body. Students are eager to explore entrepreneurship opportunities, to make a positive impact in society.

The expansion of the activities of the Career Development and Placement Cell is essential to support students in securing internship and employment opportunities that align with their career goals and aspirations.

### Q. How do you ensure that there is a convergence or agreement on the essential elements of the curriculum?

Ans. This is done by establishing clear objectives, engaging stake holders, following comprehensive assessment system and reviewing the existing curriculum in consultation with affiliating university.

### Q. How are your courses managed?

Ans. The courses are managed through blended mode which included traditional chalk and blackboard system to virtual learning classrooms, smart class and ICT enabled classes. Online classes are also conducted. Student Seminars, Projects, Study Tours and Fieldwork enhance students' learning.

### Q. Is there appropriate and up-to-date teaching learning strategy?

Ans. Yes.

### Q. How are teaching and learning organized for students?

Ans. At the onset of every academy session, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) orchestrates the development of the academic calendar by synthesizing inputs gather from individual departments. Subsequently, in adherence to university guidelines, a centralized class routine in devised. This Calanders, complemented by the delineation of Program Specific Outcomes (PSOs) and Course Outcomes (Cos), are disseminated among faculty members. This is followed by the systematic collection of syllabus distribution and curriculum planning of each teacher ensuring alignment with the prescribed academic framework.

### Q. What pedagogical approaches are used?

Ans. As put forth by the UGC, state government and affiliating university from time to time.

### Q. What strategies are used to stimulate students' participation in the class room and enhance student learning?

Ans. Within the realm of student counselling initiatives, an "Orientation Program" is routinely conducted at the outset of each academic session, complemented by a subsequent "profile mapping" endeavour. Additionally, individual department undertake remedial coaching session alongside mentor-mentee programs, aimed at bolstering student engagement and academic advancement.

### O. What resources are used in teaching and learning?

Ans. Reference books, Journals, E-resources, Lectures, Films, Multimedia, Digital learning, resources tools like ICT are frequently used by the faculties.

### Q. How is the quality of teaching maintained and enhance? How do you ensure that strategies such as effective staff development, Peer Review induction and monitoring is used?

Ans. Feedback from a diverse range of stakeholders, including students, faculty, alumni, parents and employers is systematically gathered. Parent-Teacher meetings are convened by departments. Moreover, each department conduct remedial classes and operates a mentor-mentee program. These initiatives are strategically revised to augment student engagement and enhance their overall academic achievement.

### Q. How effectively do lectures draw upon their research, scholarship or professional activity to informed their teaching?

Ans.

- Enhancing Teaching Material and Relevance: Educators who actively integrate their research
  endeavours or professional activities enrich their teaching materials with the latest
  advancements in relevant areas. This approach ensures that students remain updated by
  incorporation research findings and real-world applications into lectures, there by maintaining
  the subject's currency, engagement, and relevance to students; research pursuits.
- Fostering Critical Thinking and Analytical Skills: Educators integrates their research and
  professional expertise into teaching inspire students to develop critical thinking and analytical
  abilities. By sharing their methods and experiences, they educate students about research
  process, which in term enhances comprehension and promotes study and analysis.
  Furthermore, workshop and Research Methodology are regularly organized to support this
  educational objective.
- Inspiring Student Engagement and Motivation: Integrating research and professional activities
  into teaching not only motivates students, but also inspires them to pursue their academic and
  professional goals. Witnessing teachers engaged in innovative research or professional
  activities encourages students to actively participate and aspire towards their own academic
  and professional endeavours.

### Q. Is there any academic support including handbooks and other written documents that is given to students?

Ans. Yes

### Q. Were the faculties engaged themselves for their academic development during academic period?

Ans. Yes.

Faculty members are actively involved in diverse academic development endeavours, including publishing papers in journals, contributing book chapters and engaging in book editing. Additionally, they participated in and present papers at various regional, national and international seminars, conferences, workshops, symposiums and webinars.

### Q. What is the role of IQAC for academic development during academic periods?

Ans. Quality Initiatives by IQAC Birpara College

Birpara College, through its Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), has taken several initiatives aimed at enhancing the overall quality of education and institutional infrastructure. Here is an overview of the significant quality initiatives implemented:

- Conducting Faculty Development Programs and Professional
   Development/Administrative Programs: The IQAC conducts Faculty Development
   Programs and Professional Development/Administrative Programs for Staff to cover all
   facets of teaching-learning and other college-related activities.
- Encourage Faculty for Academic Research: With a view to encourage a spirit of research among the faculty, IQAC encourage financial assistance to be given to the faculty to attend conferences/ Workshops/ Seminars etc.
- 3. A successful completion of Green Audit: A Green Audit was successfully conducted at Birpara College under scoring the institutions dedication to environmental sustainability. The audit involved a comprehensive environmental practice, waste management system and resource utilization. The findings and recommendations from the audit are be input to use by framing Green Campus Policy.
- 4. Online special lecture series in collaboration with the Department of Sociology: The IQAC, in collaboration with the department of Sociology, organized a series of online special lectures. These lectures aimed to provide the students and faculty with diverse perspectives on the society of the area thus fostering a deeper understanding of the society legacies hitherto unexplored.
- Special Lectures organised by different departments: The IQAC, in collaboration with different departments have invited Faculty from other Institutions of Higher Education to deliver Special Lectures for students.
- 6. Add-on Courses for Skill Development: Recognizing the need for students to acquired additional skills beyond the traditional curriculum, the IQAC instructed the different departments to offer Add-on Courses and Programs focusing on developing soft skills and ICT competences. These courses are designed to enhance students<sup>†</sup> employability and prepare them for the dynamic demands of the job market.

- 7. Catering to students through Study Centres of Universities offering courses under Open and Distance Learning mode: Birpara College runs study centres of IGNOU and NSOU offering UG and PG courses under Open and Distance Learning mode to meet demands of students who cannot enrol in regular programs. The college also functions as Examination Centre for IGNOU and NSOU.
- E-Waste Management: Addressing the critical issue of electronic waste, the IQAC has implemented an effective E-Waste Management Policy.
- 9. Gender Audit: Birpara College conducted a Gender Audit to assess an improve gender equity within the institution. This audit examined the college's policies, practices and the overall work environment to identify areas where gender equality can be enhanced.
- 10. MoU with Various Institutions and NGOs: To broaden its academic an impact, Birpara College has entered into Memorandum of Understanding (MoUs) with several academic institutions, societies/organizations, and Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs). These partnerships facilitate knowledge exchange, collaborative research, and community development projects, thereby enriching the academic experience and extending the college's reach beyond its immediate community.
- 11. Approval for the Installation of Solar Pannels for meeting energy requirements of B Block, C Block and Science Block (D) including Library: The North Bengal Development Department (NBDD) has installed Solar Pannels for meeting the power needs of the B Block, C Block and Science Block (D) including Library. The project promotes environmental sustainability and will not only reduce the college's carbon footprints but also ensure a steady and alternative source of energy.
